More Air Pollution & Wildfires

Cuts Funding for New Ferries

I-2117 means more toxic air pollution, and cuts programs to prevent wildfires.

Cuts funding for 1/4 of each new ferry with the system already in crisis.




I-2117 ends protections for lakes, rivers, and streams and cuts funding for fish habitat, including:

- Cuts funding for seven fish barrier removal projects in Whatcom and Skagit Counties;
- Ends funding for restoring Fisher Creek in Skagit County; and,
- Cuts program that compensates farmers and ranchers for **planting native vegetation along salmon bearing streams**.

I-2117 cuts funding for wildfire resilience and prevention programs that make Washington state forests and communities healthier, including:

- Grants to help landowners in high-risk areas to prepare for wildfires by implementing proactive safety measures; and,
- **Restoring forests** that have the greatest potential to prevent wildfires and protect air quality.





Devastates funding to restore & modernize our ferry fleet, including:

- Cuts more than one-quarter of all funding to construct four new hybrid-electric ferries;
- Cuts **investments to convert ferries** to hybrid electric vessels; and,
- Ends funding source for **replacing the Guemes Island ferry**.
