I-2117 puts Spokane County transportation projects at risk, including:

- Completing the **North Spokane Corridor road project**;
- Expanding **Division Street Bus Rapid Transit**; and,
- Improving the **Pacific Avenue Greenway** for pedestrians and bicyclists.

I-2117 cuts funding for wildfire resilience and prevention programs that make Washington state forests and communities healthier, including:

- **Grants to help landowners in high-risk areas** to prepare for wildfires by implementing proactive safety measures; and,
- **Restoring forests** that have the greatest potential to prevent wildfires and protect air quality.



I-2117 would cut efforts in Spokane County to address air pollution, including:

- Slashes funding for the **Spokane Public Facilities District to lower costs and pollution in its buildings**;
- Ends funding for the Great Northern School District to install **new, modern ventilation systems**; and,
- Cuts funding for Eastern Washington University to make its **buildings cleaner and more energy efficient**.
